From Lent to Easter at TLC

1. Lent - a Time of Renewal

I'm slowly reading Thomas Friedman's (2017) book, "Thank You for Being Late- An Optimist's Guide to Thriving in an Age of Accelerations." His thesis is that our planet is in the grips of three gargantuan forces: 1) technology; 2) globalization; and 3) climate change and biodiversity loss. And they are all accelerating at once and affecting five dimensions of our lives: workplace, politics, geopolitics, ethics and

community. These forces are reshaping everything from how we hail a taxi cab, to the fate of nations, to our most intimate relationships. Friedman claims these forces of acceleration are providing new opportunities for individuals and groups to save the world or destroy it!

What do we need to do? We need to slow down and dare to be late and use the time we have been given to reimagine work, politics and community.

I appreciate Friedman's thesis and I agree with many of the suggestions that he has to offer. Our American lives definitely need to be reimagined! But I also ask, is that all? Are there other gargantuan forces to be wrestled with – like sin and death? What about spiritual renewal?


The Church has traditionally marked the season of Lent as a time to slow down, to reflect upon one's life, with the goal of seeking inner and outer spiritual renewal. Pope Benedict said a number of years ago: "Jesus indicates the useful instruments needed for authentic interior and community renewal: the works of charity or almsgiving, prayer, and penitence or fasting." These are important practices for us Lutherans to be reminded of as we approach the mid-point of the 40 days of Lent. Perhaps you would consider "slowing" with a half day of prayer at the Holy Cross Retreat Center as you prepare for Holy Week?:)

#### 2. TLC Holy Week Events to be mindful of:

\* Palm Sunday (April 14) - at both 9 and 11:30 worship hours, there will be a palm procession commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, beginning outside the church. There will also be a dramatic reading of the Passion from St. Luke's Gospel.


Updated general weekday church hours for Pastors Christa & Wayne:




A Seder Dinner is planned for Sunday, April 14. A sign-up sheet is in the narthex. Bring your friends and neighbors!!



#### What is the Seder?

The Seder meal served on the first night of Passover, commemorating the flight of the people of Israel from Egypt. Presided over by the heads of the family, the Seder follows a liturgy, the Haggadah, that reminds the participants of the story of the Exodus. The ritual includes blessings, the pouring and drinking of wine, ritual questions about the meaning of the meal ("Why does this night differ from all other nights?") asked by the youngest child present. The meal includes unleavened bread (matzah), moror (bitter herbs), haroset, green herbs, salt water, wine (or grape juice) a roasted egg and lamb. The various foods symbolize the bitterness of slavery and the haste with which the Israelites had to leave Egypt.

#### Why are Christians celebrating the Seder?

There many evidences that (in the New Testament and in the tradition) that Jesus was celebrating the Seder with his disciples at the time of the institution of the Last Super or the Lord's Supper. The Seder meal provides us a window into our Old Testament traditions and to be mindful of the past we share with our Jewish brothers and sisters.

#### What's the mood of the Seder?

Since the meal remembers both the slavery of the Israelites endured in Egypt and their freedom....it is serious, playful, and fun!

#### What are you to bring? <u>Middle Eastern Foods!!!!</u>

We pause during the Seder.....to have a pot-luck Middle Eastern Meal. Here are some examples of what you can bring:

- \*Spanikopta (spinach pie)
- \*Izmir kafte (middle eastern meatballs)
- \*Middle Eastern Salads
- \*Greek Dinner Salads

- \*Hummus & Pita (appetizers)
- \*Chicken with coucous & spinach
- \*Tzatsiki with pita
- \*Olives

- \*Grilled chicken or beef kebabs
- \*Eggplant with spiced bee & pine nuts
- \*Falafel \* Find something interesting to cook!!
- \*Baklava or any number of desserts suitable for Passover....use your imagination!!!

## ELCA presiding bishop pastoral message on Christchurch mosque shootings

Dear Church,

Today we awoke to the devastating news of the mass shootings at two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand. We join in mourning for the people who were killed and wounded, for their families, for the first responders and grief counselors, and for all whose lives have been shattered

today. We know that God is present in the midst of their suffering.

We know that our own Muslim neighbors here in the U.S. are also experiencing grief and fear. Many will wonder whether it is safe to attend Friday prayers today. These are not the kinds of questions that any of us should have to ask ourselves as we seek to live out our religious commitments. Yet, devastatingly, this is also a reality that binds us together as people of faith. As I wrote last November in the wake of the Tree of Life shooting: "Hate-filled violence knows no bounds – whether a Sikh Temple in Oak Creek, a Christian church in Charleston, a Jewish synagogue in Pittsburgh" – and now these mosques in New Zealand.

Together with our ecumenical and inter-religious partners, we stand shoulder to shoulder in condemning hatred, bigotry, racism and violence whenever and wherever it occurs. We do so because all people are made in the image of God. Therefore, as an act of neighborly love, I urge you to reach out to your Muslim neighbors today and in the days to come to ask how you might offer solidarity and support – joining whenever possible with other ecumenical and inter-religious neighbors.

I leave you with the words of Psalm 16:1: "Protect me, O God, for in you I take refuge." This is my prayer – for our Muslim neighbors, for the people of Christchurch, and for all who mourn and are afraid. May we see in this devastation the possibility to be Christ's presence with our neighbors in this world – to be present in their suffering and to be partners in God's justice and peace.

## Second Annual Trinity Lutheran Church Stations of the Cross Walk

(with Pastors Wayne & Christa)

When: Good Friday, April 19, 2019

Where: Holy Cross Retreat Center

600 Holy Cross Rd., Mesilla Park, NM

Time: 9 AM

Meet: At Holy Cross Retreat Center shortly

before 9 AM outside the Chapel of the Holy Cross Center. Since it is outdoors, dress for the weather.

Who to invite? Your friends, neighbors or family members of any age or denomination (or no denomination at all).

The Stations of the Cross is a form of Catholic devotion that remembers the passion and death of Jesus. This tradition began in the  $4^{th}$  century when Christians went on pilgrimages to the Holy Land. Each of the 14 stages recalls a specific event that took place on Good Friday. We will be using a Protestant liturgy which consists of prayers, meditations and short periods of silence at each of the 14 events. We will be doing the outdoor stations, located just outside the chapel and should last about an hour.

Why pray the Stations of the Cross? Eight reasons: 1) They allow us to place our trust in Jesus; 2) They put us in the story; 3) They remind us that Jesus suffers with us; 4) They compel us to action; 5) They help us make a decision for or against Christ; 6) They reveal God's response to evil in the world; 7) They give us the certainty of God's love for us; and 8) They guide us from the cross to the resurrection. — Pope Francis


